Dear Friends,

Year after year, as Life moves on, we tend to become more philosophical due to some of our own compatriots departing from us into oblivion. Still, we resolve to carry on as we have to live till death really snatches us away. Since long, I believed in ' Jeevan Mukti', that is to live your Life in Full, but with utmost detachment! Nachi keta talks about it in 'Kaṭhopaniṣad'.

Covid epidemic tore us apart in this 2021. Three of our UVCT warriors – Mr Abdul Raqueeb of Visakha Chapter(on October 9,2020); Mr Jami Govind Rao, coordinator of Tekkali 'Pragati Patham' (on October 2, 2020); and Mr X.M. David, husband of Mrs Sabrina David of Mumbai Chapter (on July 22, 2020)- succumbed to the dreaded Covid menace. We have experienced an unusual situation and had to adopt ingenuine ways and means to cope up with these threats of Carona.

The activities of the Trust obviously suffered. The last phase of Delhi's Reformation and Rehabilitation programme of Young Offenders in Tihar Jail had to be modified due to ban of entering Tihar Jail premises, with more emphasis on Rehabilitation of offenders who are out on Parole or other. The Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), which funded the Project were very accommodative and helped in successful completion of the project. It ended with a Trans India Webinar to talk about the gains of our 3-year long endeavour. The holistic approach of Mumbai Chapter for empowering 10,000 students from 30 schools, which was renewed for second year (Saksham 2) also ended prematurely due to closure of schools. We have been pursuing with the Mahanagar Gas Limited (MGL) for release of the pending grants. The third major programme, Childline at Kalyan Railway Station (Maharashtra), continued to do well, with the relevant Project personnel tried to play the role of Covid Warriors. The long continuing Target Intervention program for HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention campaign amongst migrant workers of Wazirpur Industrial complex has also done well. In order to focus on our own core functions, we got the IGNOU Study Centre closed. Tekkali's Pragati Patham, a Resource Centre for job seekers, continued to function.

The Sohan Lal Commodities Private Limited (SLCM), New Delhi generously continued their support for an adolescent-centric counselling and empowerment programme. The Tagore Garden Centre, New Delhi, sustained it's activities despite the Covid restrictions. Thanks to the Team, especially our Vice Chairman Dr Girish Kumar of Mumbai and General Secretary Shri BS Negi in Delhi, who ably pursued our avowed objectives...with love to all.

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The Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust (UVCT) is a non-governmental organization, striving for the social and economic empowerment of young People (10 to 24 years) since 1991. In 2017-18, UVCT celebrated its Silver Jubilee and expanded its activities and outreach through its various chapters in India and the US. UVCT hopes to fulfill its vision by perseverance and passion. This year we increased our reach to Maharashtra with projects under Childline, Saksham, Happy Projects and in Delhi with Reformation and Rehabilitation project in Tihar Jail.

Vision

UVCT's vision is to find ways and means to transform the ever-growing population of India or this "Burden of Population" into an "Asset of Human Resource" and thereby, help in ensuring better utilisation of India's demographic dividend.

Mission

UVCT has been striving to work for the development of adolescents and young adults of the nation through "empowerment" rather than "control", and bring the dropouts, underachievers, and children in conflict with law, especially those belonging to marginalised and deprived sections of society, back to mainstream. It is UVCT's mission to help these children to become socially responsible and economically productive citizens of India and the world.

Objectives

- 1. Develop awareness through seminars, group discussions and camps to help young adults find solutions to their problems- psychological, financial, ethical and social;
- 2. Help young adults acquire a realistic value system that is conducive to the development of a healthy society and to develop the concept of oneness of all religions and love for the homeland in the youth, by raising their level of consciousness;

- 3. Develop educational and skill training programs for school dropouts and under-achievers, to enable them to become not only economically productive but also socially responsible citizens of India and the world;
- 4. Develop counseling centres for disturbed youth; and to establish rehabilitation centres for juvenile delinquents to provide both emotional support and skill training;
- 5. Develop skills among the young adults and women related to textiles, handicrafts and other ancillary Industries;
- 6. Endeavour to promote equality of status and opportunity, assuring dignity of individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation. Ensure optimal services for the hygiene, health and happiness for all citizens of India; and
- 7. Provide Financial Literacy for Youth and Women in backward communities for employment and awareness related to formal banking.

Advocacy

UVCT has been actively engaged in advocating for the issues of Adolescents since its beginning, be it a National Meet "Towards policy for Young Adults" held in 1999, which resulted in a report on Adolescents (2001) by Planning Commission; another National Meet was held in July 2005 on theme "Adolescents: Vision 2020" in order to draw the attention of the policy makers and relevant segments of the society about the challenges being faced by and opportunities available for the adolescents; and another National Seminar on "Demographic Dividend: Challenges of Young People in India" was held on 6th May 2015 at India International Center, New Delhi.

In furtherance, on the occasion of Silver jubilee celebrations of the organisation, UVCT had organized a National Consultation Meet on the Theme "Mainstreaming Skills in Education" on 6th December 2017 at India International Center, New Delhi.



Highlights of the Year

BPCL Joins UVCT for the Reformation and Life Skills Programme at Tihar

UVCT gained BPCL's support from 1st August 2019 for its innovative project which was started by the UVCT in 2017. The project, first of its kind in India, where young offenders(aged 18 to 21 yrs) are put to reformation processes through Life Skill Education, backed by psychoanalytical therapies, vocational guidance and rehabilitation support. This holistic support is provided to bring down the spiralling trends of crime and re-integrating young offenders into main-stream of the society.

UVNAC: Inauguration of 'Achintya Tejas Conference Hall' & Consultative Meet on 'Adolescents and Social Media' on 12th Feb 2020

A consultative meet on theme "Adolescents and Social Media" was held on 12th February, 2020 at Urivi Vikram National Centre for Adolescents (UVNAC), Dwarka, New Delhi. The meeting marked the inaugural of the 'Achintya Tejas Conference Hall'



at Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust. The conference hall is named in the memory of Dr. Rao's grandson and a wonderful soul, late. Achintya Tejas Garikaparthi, who was killed in a road accident in Bahamas at an age of 19 years. The meet was attended by academicians, school principals, counsellors, media persons, journalists, police personnel, practitioners, NGOs representatives and other professionals with similar interests.

The chief guest on the occasion, Shri Tejendra Khanna, former Lt. Governor of Delhi, in his address shared his concern on the loss of moral values and reading habits in today's children and youth; emphasized the role of parents and teachers and called for building a balance between inner life and outer life, based on TRUE LOVE between all beings. Dr. N Bhaskara Rao, founder Chairman, Centre for Media Studies (CMS), in his inaugural address cognized the important role and potential of social media for connectivity and communication. He also referred to the emerging trends viz. productivity age being reduced from 25-30 year age group to 15-25 year age group, as a consequence of accessibility and exposure to social media. Social media should be enabling young adolescents to think not only big but also beyond. In view of the surveillance role social media has acquired, substantiating with evidence, he later called for a cautious approach; prohibiting/ limiting access of social media to children below 9


years and a foundational back up of cultural values and ethos rooted in family traditions of India like Grandmother's tales.

Dr. UNB Rao, Founder Chairman of the UVCT, reflected that social Media has multiple effects on Adolescents and as a National Centre for Adolescents, we need to study this and look at coping and preventive mechanisms. He added that UVNAC intends conducting a National Seminar on the same issue preceded by surveys and more consultative meets.

A presentation was made by CYPAD, Delhi Police that portrayed the nature and extent of cybercrime in India and how police could help in tackling a problem Subsequent interactions amongst the eminent participants brought out the various experiences in use / misuse of social media., Some elaborated on the magnitude of social media addiction and its









consequences like substance abuse, early initiation into sex and growing intolerance among children and adolescents emerged as an important concern. Alongside, some of them also cited how they are handing the perceived menace to the advantage of the user.

The Meet served the desired purpose and encouraged UVNAC to go in for more elaborate and target-oriented studies.

Launch of Saksham II

Saksham II commenced on 15th Jun 2019 and held its first Principal's meet on July 4th 2019 in the gracious presence of the Chairman Dr. U N B Rao and Vice Chairman Mrs. Urivi Chaya Rao. The Deputy Education Officer of North East Mumbai inaugurated the meet with the traditional lighting of the lamp. The MGL officials, Mrs. Neera Asthana (Deputy Manager - CSR), Mr. Nishant Sinha (CSR - Manager), Mrs. Namita Vanmalli also graced the occasion with their presence. Much went into the strategic planning of the project before its final implementation. Our remedial teachers were well trained and motivated to take up the challenge. With full gusto they started work by taking up the schools designated to them as

per their subject expertise. It was indeed a herculean task for the teachers to start from A B C, but a sustained and diligent effort worked well. With the cooperation of the principals and regular teachers did yield the fruits of labour. A uniformed syllabus and decided conspectus of selected topics for each subject and each standard with a set of books given to the teacher made it meticulous and systemized learning for students. Some Principals demanded for more teaching time from our teachers.

Other Activities at UVNAC

SPSS (Statistical Package for Social Sciences) workshop

UVCT organised a successful workshop on SPSS on 19th October 2019. SPSS is a statistical and userfriendly tool which is widely used in academics by researchers, students and professionals of Social Sciences. The workshop, conducted by Ms. Arshiya Kochar (MSc. University of Kent), was attended by about 75 students and professionals, in two Sessions. . The software was provided to the participants and hands-n practice during the Session. The participants were also extended online guidance for one week after the workshop.

Counselling Workshop

The workshop was dedicated to the topic on Counselling from Carl Roger's perspective on 1st March 2020. The workshop emphasised on some crucial practices such as client centred therapy,



Humanistic and Existential perspective. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Eva Das, Research Scholar, DU and Mr. Raunaq Chawla, Asst. Prof. JIMS. The session highlighted that main ingredients of Counselling are Empathy and Unconditional Positive regard. The workshop also included some fun activities that lightened the audience mood. Overall, it was an interactive and informative workshop.

TARGET Intervention Wazirpur

HIV/AIDS Awareness, prevention and identification program in Wazirpur Ind. Area Delhi

UVCT is running Targeted intervention program at Wazirpur, Mangolpuri, Haiderpur Industrial area under the agis of Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS)

Our team reaches out to the vulnerable people, making them aware of the risks and connecting them to services provided by the National AIDS Control Programme.

HIV/AIDS still remains a leading health problem in the world. India is also facing from this problem at a



vast level. Indian government is trying to prevention of HIV/AIDS with the help of NGOs. Indian government has made a plan that every HIV+ people should know their statues till 2030 so that new HIV+ cases could be stopped in future. In this regard UVCT has been also running targeted intervention program to prevention of HIV/AIDS among migrant workers who come from other states for surviving. UVCT team reaches out migrant people to make them aware about HIV/AIDS, STI, ICTC testing etc. UVCT team spreads awareness amongst the migrants for safe sex which is the main source o HIV/AIDS. Further, UVCT team gets the high-risk people ICTC tested and gets HIV infected people linked to ART center. UVCT facilitates all aids which are provided by DSACS.

A couple of HIV stories from our bag:

- 1. UVCT team identified an HIV+ case in CBS camp in Mangolpuri industrial area, who was young about 25 years old. He was the main source of income in his six members' family. He was linked ART center in Baba Saheb Ambedkar hospital. Now he is taking ART regularly and pink in health and doing job.
- 2. Our UVCT team found three HIV cases in March 2020. One case was very critical but our UVCT team taken this one very seriously and linked him to ART center in Baba Saheb Ambedkar Hospital and got him admitted for other treatment for 14 days. Now he is good in health.



In every trimester, many students complete their various courses under their trainers. To appreciate their hardwork and sincerity, UVCT





exams.



course, I have applied for job in leading beauty parlor and getting good salary as well.



Tihar Intervention

Over the last decade, there has been an increase in number of youth entering the prison system for first time and also reoffending (Crime in India, NCRB report). The Lipsey (2009) international review classified the various programs into broad categories based on their philosophy and general approach. The results showed that 'therapeutic' interventions were generally more effective at reducing reoffending than those that were primarily focused on punitive or control based approaches. Therefore, reformation should aim to target and address 'dynamic' factors (i.e. those that can change over time, e.g. an individual's drug use or motivation to change). For example, consideration should be given to providing interventions and support that can bolster self-esteem and resilience, appropriately challenge and change certain thought process, increase skills, and facilitate viable alternative options to an individual's lifestyle. The importance of practitioner ways of working with young people, the 'therapeutic alliance', both in secure institutions and community, is emphasized in gualitative studies (Jane, 2010). Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust bases its philosophies on the same lines as discussed above or in simple words, observes Restorative Justice **Practise styles**





UVCT had enrolled 1000 young adult offenders in the Life Skills based Education program in the Better Life Prison School in the year 2019, from January 2019 to December 2019

Successfully conducted fifteen 45 days module program for heinous and hardened offenders and twenty five 15 days module program for the

first time offenders

- They were subjected to Life Skills based Education in an organized form as regular classes over the period of the course
- Improved change in Criminal Propensity observed







Psychotherapy

UVCT has a special focus on **reformation of the young adults through Psychotherapies.** Sessions of Individual Counselling, Group Counselling and Career Counselling are conducted through professional and evidence based techniques. **Cognitive Behavioural Therapy** is the most common used technique by the professionals.

From the interaction and a detailed analysis of individuals who were subjected to therapy the following problems have been shortlisted

- **High Neuroticism** indicates anxiety, worry, fear, anger, frustration, envy, jealousy, guilt, depressed mood and loneliness
- Assumes minor frustrations as hopelessly difficult
- Delayed Gratification
- Leads to mood disorders, anxiety disorders and substance use disorders
- **High Social Desirability** indicates self consciousness and rationalization as a defence mechanism
- Feelings of **low self worth** and powerlessness is often denied
- Inflated sense of self
- High Lie scores doesn't indicate the Individual's state of mind or situation at different times, rather it is an indicative of their personality, to often end up in other's good books

UVCT successfully catered psychotherapies to fifty individuals based on different psychological issues. The criteria of selection are abnormal scores in criminal propensity test or referral from prison staff. Cognitive Behavioural Therapies are used to attend to the problem.

After-Care

The real impact of the Education and Therapies can only be measured by how well the individuals repatriate, or in simple words how well they adjust back to the society. UVCT also has a post release mechanism where the individuals are catered. The individuals are subjected to career counselling, Individual counselling, family counselling and booster shots of life skills. The individuals keep in touch through regular phone calls and messages. They also visit the Head Office, UVNAC where they are subjected to further motivational sessions.

Mumbai

Established in 1991, the Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust (UVCT) works for the development of adolescent and young adults (empowerment) rather than control. The trust visualizes that due care must be given to the stage of adolescence (aged between 10 - 19 years) a period of rapid development and identity crisis in one's growth. UVCT partnered with Mahanagar Gas Ltd. to sustain and achieve its goal through its project Saksham II. Phase I of Saksham I was successfully completed in November 2018. With the same objectives in mind - MGL continued its support for Saksham II as an extension in its second consecutive year.

Launch of Saksham II

With much enthersiasm contiued this year with training help for oriented in , infrastincline sschools.

The teachers were empowered by experts of each subject in the day long training module. A two - day holistic approach training was given to the teachers in the 'Quest program' conducted by the Lions Club of Ghatkopar. Science teachers were trained by the professor of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research in how to show practical in an indigenous manner without the regular apparatus. Maths and English was also taught in a whole way to interpret to the students in a play way method with new techniques.









The student's zeal and enthusiasm to learn was seen just before the SSC board exams in Maharashtra

Parent Orientations and Mohalla Meets, oh my God! what an amazing response we had this year from 300 to 3000 parents- Jewelry making, soap making (organic soaps), chocolate making, paper bag making, designer paper bags, envelopes and gift wrapping. Parents were asking for more such workshops' Yeh Dil Maange More'.



Counseling had a tremendous impact with terrific results. Group as well as individual counselling highlighted the promising and problematic cases whose sessions went on till the end of February 2020.



Supposed to crack the board classes for a Week went on for over a month with a steady group of students attending the same for four hours everyday. The remedial teachers gave their very best to the children



Infrastructure help to schools was remarkable as 3 schools repaired their classrooms well before the Monsoon. Seven schools were given the latest projectors which can project images/movies and









any other visuals from the mobile phone directly with high definition precision. Twenty schools had varied demand which have been complied with before the end of 2020 itself.

Case Study

Making a difference



Nemichand B. Phulwariya aged 16 yrs. student of 10th std. from Gyan Vikas School scored 41% in the 9th Std.

He is son of a footwear maker who hails from Uttar Pradesh. His ailing father operates from a

small one room kitchen house. He stays in slums and has two more siblings. Elder brother helps his father in the business. Because of his financial conditions he was not able to attend any tuition classes. Maths, Science & English were his weak subjects and he always found it too difficult to understand. He also helps his father and brother in the business during day time. Mother and younger sister both do all the household chores. Both elder brother and younger sister are not educated but Nemichand wants to study further and so he joined the Night School.

When I joined the extra classes run by UVCT my performance in English, Maths & Science subjects improved.

His elder brother is of the opinion that because of their family conditions he could not study but as Nemichand has the interest and wants to achieve something we will give him full support in his studies.

Teachers at Night school say that he is good in his studies and behavior.



UVCT gave a month long special coaching to the needy students of 10th Std. in English, Maths and Science subjects.

Remedial Teacher Mrs. Gomathi Ramachandran who taught English

to Nemichand says that he was a silent boy when he started to come for the 10th std. Board exam preparation. After a month's session in English, he could answer the question paper and also manage to get passing marks.

Similarly for Maths because of the special training he could understand the concepts and theorems in Geometry. This has helped him to perform better in the practice board paper given by Ankush Sir.

In Science, Suvarna Mhaske the special educator gave a digital teaching of all the lessons. A better performance was seen in the practice Board papers.

His aspiration is to pursue further studies in computers after graduation and become an officer. UVCT tried helping him in his studies by giving a free crash course of 25 days just before the commencement of SSC board exams.



UVCT will try to guide him in selecting higher studies according to his interest and capabilities and also help him in finding institutes that provide computer courses.

Aditya Santosh Ranjane, aged 14 years, a student of Std. 10 from

Savitribai Phule School, Ghatkopar, Mumbai. He scored 85% in the 9th std. and studies in a Marathi medium school.



His father is a driver in a private firm & mother is a house wife. Both parents have studied up to Xth std. He has an elder sister studying in XIIth. The

family stays at Ramabai Nagar colony. Although financially stable they stay in a small room where studies for both him and his sister are not possible. So sometimes he studies in the common garden at night so that the other family members do not get disturbed by his studies.

Says Aditya :

"My immediate aim is to score above 75% but I was finding it difficult as I was not able to score in English & Mathematics. Gokula mam & Vijay Sir helped me to regain my confidence. They gave me good practice of solving board papers & showed me my mistakes where I was losing marks.

Today I am sure to get a Distinction in the Board examinations."



Aditya's father says that Aditya is very keen to pursue higher studies so he will work hard to make his dream come true.

Teachers of his school say that he is a very sincere student and has a very good family support.

Aditya is a bright student who was given UVCT scholarship last year. However he was not able to score full marks in Mathematics & was weak in English. He honestly spoke to me & wished to improve in both subjects. We started giving him simple questions to answer from board papers & that is how he started gaining confidence. Today he is confident to get a distinction.

Aditya wants to join Local Administration services in Maharashtra. For this he must have a minimum FIRST CLASS throughout starting from X Board examination. UVCT has helped Aditya by giving him highly knowledgeable and experienced teachers and special classes were conducted on Sundays for the same. After his exams UVCT is willing to provide Career Counseling sessions and help him choose the best possible options.

UVCT Kalyan Railway Childline

'UVCT KALYAN has completed three years in December 2019; Team Childline has been working extremely hard, yet quietly. These years have shown the maturity grow to a new level and the commitment and sense of responsibility towards the society grown to extremely high level...

Is it easy to find the home of a child who is lost ?...there are many stories, where team had been threatened to change their decisions against the favour of child rights..But UVCT Kalyan railway childline stood strong in making the right decisions in favour of children..That's a mission well executed.'

UVCT Kalyan Railway Childline has been phenomenal in the year 2019-2020

The reason is quite simple...out of the 521 cases 99% cases have been handed over to their parents and the children are in safe hands of the parents, but it is not that easy...to find the address and contact numbers of the parents..the skills of the team are challenged... Team Kalyan Railway Childline have so far proved they are the best in this challenging space!

Usually 99% children do not give contact numbers, here the counselling of the child comes in to play.



one way to track is to send a message to all police stations regarding missing complaints..the other way to track is to send police squad to the address location and search the child's location. The local MLA helped many times if a child's address has to be found.

The team has risen in the use of technology, being smart and resourceful to find location of the child e.g Facebook, WhatsApp etc. Many a times team was given a contact number which is switched off.. but when searched on WhatsApp the number was active..on facebook too. Sometimes if required, team members visit the place themselves..trusting the child. There are 100 different ways to find the child's address..and contact number and the team has mastered in it..because first priority of the team is that the child should reach his /her parents..

The participation and involvement in activities by the team was up to the mark..with most of the planning and implementation done by the women WARRIORS of Childline team..starting with the begging campaign in June to Womens day in March.. focus towards work was highest..the team was at the peak and stood strong even during the disastrous floods...

COUNSELLING-

The implementation and confidence shown by the counsellor and the team in handling the activities , cases is outstanding. The dedication shown towards work was also remarkable.

On 2nd December 2019, UVCT Childline project completed three years of functioning.

The commitment and skills shown by UVCT Kalyan Railway Childline at the station have been outstanding. With the guidance of our honorable Director Ms. Smita Chitre and Ms. Nupur Tyagi.They have been the supporting pillars the Childline team always wanted.

Child rights activist Abdul Raqeeb (57) died in the early hours of Friday. He was admitted to a private hospital a few days ago, after testing positive for COVID-19.

Raqeeb was an advocate and served as a member of Juvenile Justice Board, District Legal Services Authority and as vice-president of Visakha Forum for Child Rights.

Rahimunnisa Begum, joint secretary, Visakha Forum for Child Rights, said that he worked tirelessly for the cause of child rights and improvement of correctional schools. He is survived by his wife and two sons.

Forum of Legal Professionals on Friday condoled the death of Abdul Raqeeb. He was also one of the founding members of the forum, said Kuppili Muralidhar of the forum.


