Founder Chairman's Message



Dear Friends,

We have gone through one of the rarest phases of life. Covid menace over-shadowed all the activities of life. The upswing seen in February took a bigger toll. The fear of Corona, with all its threatened variants, remains palpable. Isn't it strange to note that most of the people, including working class, go around with a mask put on? In 'Masks', recognition has become a puzzle!

UVCT team tried to be careful, but could not desist from reaching out to people in distress. We lost two of our warriors – Abdul Raqueeb from Visakhapatnam centre and Govind Rao from Tekkali centre. Our activities through Childline, Kalyan Station and Wazirpur HIV/AIDS programme continued even in these hard days. Our Skill Development Centres in Tagore Garden (New Delhi) and in Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh), produced hundreds of masks and distributed to the needy.

As a new normal, most of the gatherings are now happening through social media. Thankfully, due to these online platforms, we were also able to do two Webinars. On 26th August, 2020, the Webinar on theme "Crusade for Reformation and Rehabilitation of Young Offenders from Tihar Prisons" was held, in a bid to showcase our innovative work with young offenders during the last three years. Sh. Sudhir Yadav, Ex-DCP Prisons, Tihar, who promoted the programme and his successor, Mr. Sandeep Goel, DG Prisons, spoke, along with other stake holders. Two other learned speakers at the webinar were Prof Vijay Raghavan from TISS and Ms. Kavita Srikant, Counsellor and Crisis Management Expert, Brahamas. Another webinar was organised on 23rd November, 2020, during the Restorative Justice week, on "Tracking growth of Restorative Justice in India". Shri. Somesh Goyal, DG Police, Himachal Pradesh gave the key note address, followed by Dr. Beulah Shekar, Emeritus Professor, Department of Criminology, Karunaya Institute of Technology & Sciences, Coimbatore.

During the year, UVCT tried to cope up with shortage of funding with the support of the rental income from the Punjab National Bank branch, that is located in the building. It is indeed a well-thought provision of Delhi Development Authority, which allows renting out of 25 per cent of the premises, for the sustenance and growth of the organisation. The financial support rendered by the Sohal Lal Commodity Management (SLCM) was utilised with their kind concurrence in procuring and distribution of blankets and other winter gear to the needy and vulnerable segments in different areas of Delhi.

We thank the UVCT team, especially my wife Chaya who also happens to be a Vice-Chairperson of the Trust, for working hard to help run the organisation despite inadequate fund supply.

Origin

UVCT was founded by Dr. UNB Rao and his wife, Urivi Chaya, with the support of a few friends, in fond memory of their only son, Urivi Vikram. Rao family worked to empower adolescents and young adults, especially from lower S.E.S. UVCT's priority target group comprises drop-outs and under-achievers, besides school going children. UVCT has a motto of finding ways and means to transform the India's '**Burden of Population**', into '**Asset of Human Resources**', through a process of empowerment, rather than of control. During last 30 years, UVCT catering to the needs of young adults through various projects like Prerna, Shakti, Sahara, Parivartan and Ummeed, etc.

UVCT's vision is to find ways and means to transform the ever-growing population of India or this "Burden of Population" into an "Asset of Human Resource" and thereby, help in ensuring better utilization of India's demographic dividend.

- ❖ **Provide Financial Literacy for Youth & Women:** Provide Financial Literacy for youth and women in backward communities for employment and formal banking related awareness.

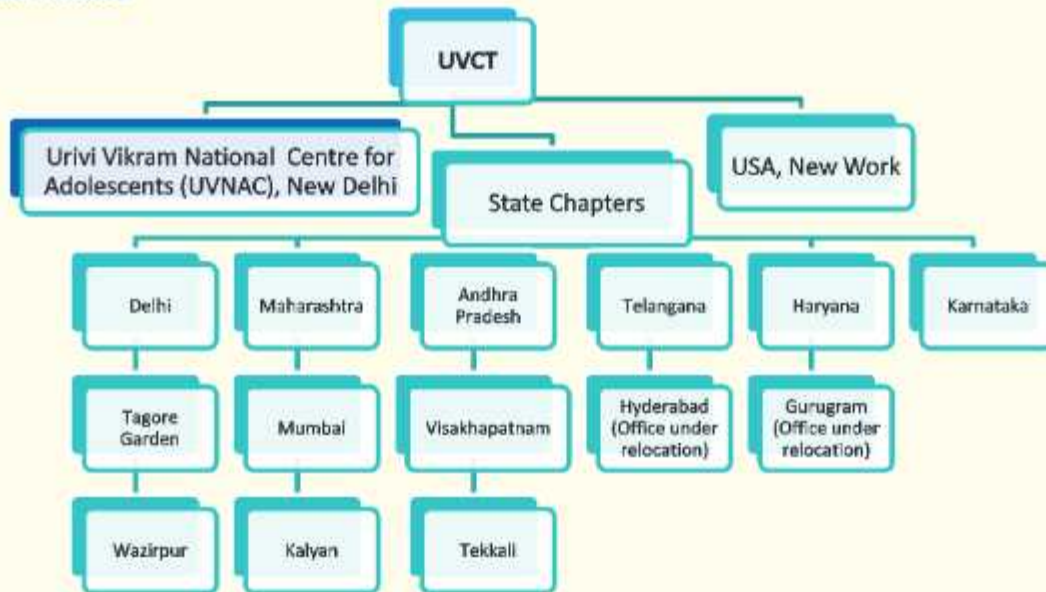


Advocacy

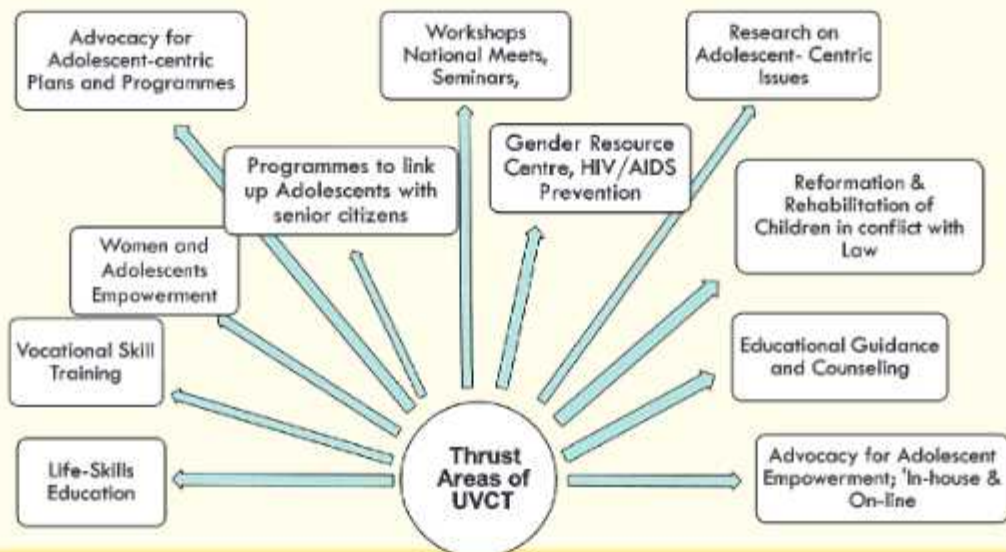

available for the adolescents; and another National Seminar on "Demographic Dividend: Challenges of Young People in India" was held on 6th May 2015 at India International Center, New Delhi. In furtherance, on the occasion of silver jubilee celebrations of the organisation, UVCT had organized a National Consultation Meet on the Theme "Mainstreaming Skills in Education" on 6th December 2017 at India International Center, New Delhi.

Highlights of the Year

URIVI VIKRAM NATIONAL CENTRE FOR ADOLESCENTS (UVNAC)

Urivi Vikram National Centre for Adolescent (UVNAC), is the national headquarters for UVCT. The headquarters does not only coordinate and monitor activities in UVCT's centres in Delhi and chapters in other states but also runs various projects and activities on regular basis. This year, when the whole world has been affecting from Covid-19 Pandemic, the centre was engaged in fulfilling its responsibility with utmost diligence. Some of the major activities conducted by UVNAC during the year 2020-21 are as follows:

Report Submission on Reformation and Life Skills Programme for Young Offenders under Trial at Tihar

The project on Reformation and Rehabilitation of Young offenders at Tihar Jail, was in vogue for over two years, got strengthened and evolved into a well-structured and articulated programme due to the funds received from the Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL).

Objectives

- Criminal profiling and classification based on a specially designed Initial Intake Form, to help work out specific reformation processes to different groups of offenders;
- Modify the Life Skill Modules that were brought out by UN Inter-agencies Group, with specific purposes in view and augment those with all possible audio and video material;
- Regular evaluations of effects of impact on the basis of established psychometric instruments (Sanyal's Criminal Propensity Test, Morality Test and the like);
- Developing formats for referral to in-depth counselling and psycho-analytical processes;

- Capacity building for jail staffs as to develop better attitude towards Prison system and inmates.
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (working on their present situation, rather than digging into their past) inmates through Life Skills education, Individual and Group Counselling; close monitoring and Impact Analysis;
- Extending Orientation to vocational courses; Skill Building and Up Skilling; net working with existing vocational courses with in premises of jail 5;
- Continued Reformation and Rehabilitation of offenders to the extent possible, even after release from Jail (Bail/acquittal/discharge).
- Formatting the Processes and Mechanisms, so that those are emulated by other Jails in India and even in foreign countries; and
- Most importantly, check the spiraling crime trends, by focusing on hardened and repeat offenders.

Methodology

Formation of Batches: Based on profiling, suggestions received from prison staff and UVCT personal visits & observations, different batches were formed.

Modules: UVCT has pioneered in Life Skills based Education. As a part of non-formal education focusing on the holistic development of the individual, UVCT devised a special Life Skills program for young offenders. The module focussing on **ten core life skills** as laid down by the World Health Organisation (WHO) was used. In addition, topics like health and hygiene, sexual and reproductive health and substance abuse, traffic rules, etc. were also included based on the needs and expectations of the learners.

Sessions were based on two modules designed specifically on the basis of the gravity of the criminal act.



1. 15 days' module
2. 45 days' module

Classroom: To impart and make the sessions interesting, UVCT revamped the classroom into a state of the art, student friendly Life Skills Lab. To keep up with the digital age and new age technology, a 55" LED smart TV has also been set-up to observe maximum result and evidence-oriented efficiency, besides a LED Projector and relevant audio -visual material.

Major Activities



Key achievements

- A total of 12 A batches (45 days program) and 30 B batches (15 days program) were successfully conducted. Each session is covered in both theoretical as well as activity mode.
- The Life Skills beneficiaries are observed to be more humane, more courteous, less neurotic, show less social desirability
- A total of 900 individuals received the certificate
- Attitudinal changes observed in inmates, leading them to reformation and rehabilitation, so that they become socially acceptable and economically productive citizens.

Webinar on Crusade for Reformation & Rehabilitation of Young Offenders from Tihar Prisons

On successful completion of the project, a webinar on "Crusade for Reformation and Rehabilitation of Young Offenders from Tihar Prisons" was jointly organised by UVCT and BPCL on 26th August, 2020. The aim of the webinar was to discuss possible ways forwards in the field of reformation and rehabilitation of young offender.

The event started with the host welcoming the speakers and participants and giving a brief introduction about the project. The Chairperson Dr. UNB Rao, Chairperson, UVCT briefed about UVCT and presented some major findings of the project. An AV was also shown presenting the project objectives, methodology, analysis and findings. Respectable speakers, Sh. Sudhir Yadav, Ex-DGP Prisons, Tihar, Ms. Kavita Srikant, Counsellor and CS Expert, Brahamas Prison, Mr. Sandeep Goel (IPS), DG Prisons, Tihar also shared their views based on their experiences. Mr Lalt Watts, Chief General Manager (HR) and Shri BV Gokhale, Chief Manager (Admn.) represented Bharat Petroleum.





They explained how they were unsure about the results because of the deviant history of the clients. But through the efforts of UVCT team, and their continuous visits, they could conclude that the efforts were in the right direction. The event included participants from all fields of Criminal Justice System. Lawyers, Academicians, Prison staff, Professionals from various fields and Students.

Webinar on Tracking Growth of Restorative Justice in India

Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust conducted a webinar on "Tracking growth of Restorative Justice in India" on 23rd November, 2020. The week from 15th November to 22nd November is celebrated as Restorative Justice Week all over the world. The Webinar also focused on the same lines of tracking Restorative Justice practices in India.

As Restorative Justice is a new concept in crime prevention and as India is trying to keep up with the policies in the world, UVCT took a lead in organizing a webinar focusing on the scope and applicability of Restorative Justice Philosophies in India.

The valuable panel of speakers include Dr. UNB Rao, Founder Chairman of UVCT, Dr. Beulah Shekar, who is currently is the Emeritus Professor, Department of Criminology, School of Arts, Media & Management, Karunaya Institute of Technology & Sciences, Coimbatore, Shri. Somesh Goyal, IPS DGP, Himachal Pradesh, who also served as the DGP (Prisons). As his service has completely been as a Criminal Justice functionary (he has been both DG Prisons as well as Police), and Arlene Manoharan, representing Enfold Proactive Health Trust, Bengaluru. Arlene Manoharan is a social worker, specializing in child protection and juvenile justice, with three decades of experience since her post-graduation in Social Work from the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai, in 1990.

The talk ended on a note by Dr. Rao. As a veteran Police Officer who has served more than 40 years in field as well as academic part of the State, he suggested for action plans and ways to take the initiative forward. A follow-up meet with possible to-do points will be conducted in the near future.

Activities under Swachhta Pakhwada in collaboration with Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL)

UVCT in association with BPCL had organised some activities under 'Swachhta Pakhwada'. Originally the project was planned for March 2020, but due to COVID-19 restrictions the project was carried out later effectively. Following activities were organised under the project:





Distribution of Health Kits: 200 health kit consists of N-95 Masks, 100 ml Sanitizers and Soaps were distributed in slums near Dwarka, Tihar Staff and in Police Station, Sector- 23, Dwarka.

Dustbins Installation: 30 dustbins were installed in different locations of Dwarka were finalized with the assistance of SDMC officials.

Cleanliness and Maintenance Drives in Skill Development Centre, Tagore Garden and UVNAC: Some of the long-pending cleanliness and maintenance tasks (including painting and polishing) were undertaken and thereby, extended possible livelihood to about 10 workers from nearby slum areas, whose families were otherwise starving due to lack of work in lockdown period.

Stitching and Distribution of Handmade Masks: 2000 masked for children and grown-ups were stitched by the Stitching unit of Skill Development Centre, Tagore Garden. The marks were distributed to needy, RWAs for their staff, UVCT TI Centre (HIV/AIDS Prevention), Children/Observation Homes in slum areas of Pochanpur and around .

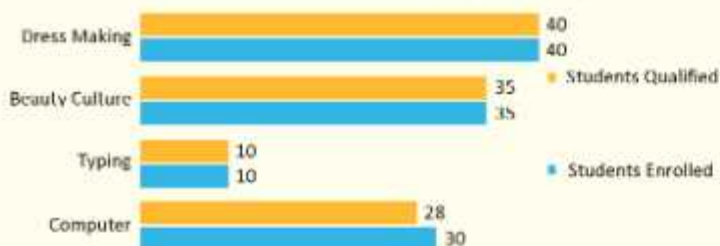
Moral: With determination, courage, and fearlessness, one can pass through any obstacle.

TARGET INTERVENTION

UVCT Targeted Intervention Center for HIV/AIDS is located in Wazirpur Industrial Area, North-West district of Delhi under the aegis of Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS). Aims of the centre are to help the migrant population living away from families and belong to different States constitute High Risk Group (HRG). ICTC services, organising health camps, running awareness programmes, outreach programmes, registration of HRGs, and condom promotions are some activities which are conducted to reach out the target population.

During the lockdown, when everybody was inside the home for safety reasons, UVCT front line workers carried out their responsibilities team diligence without by risking their own lives. The team went in the field and made people aware about HIV/AIDS and other health facilities by following

social distance norms. ICTC tests were conducted on HRG people and HIV positive people were made linked to ART centre for further treatment. The team also contributed in spreading awareness about COVID-19. UVCT provided many other helps for migrant population during the pandemic as helping in providing food, distribution of mask, gloves, sanitizers etc. Though the team tried its best to follow all safety precautions against Covid-19, unfortunately, one of our staff members got infected with Covid-19. UVCT team followed all guideline and aids which was provided (DSACS) Delhi States Aids Control Society and NACO.

The team identified 5 HIV positive cases during the year and linked one case to ART centre successfully. ICTC testing was done on 3194 people and 55 STI cases were found in the health camps organized during the year.

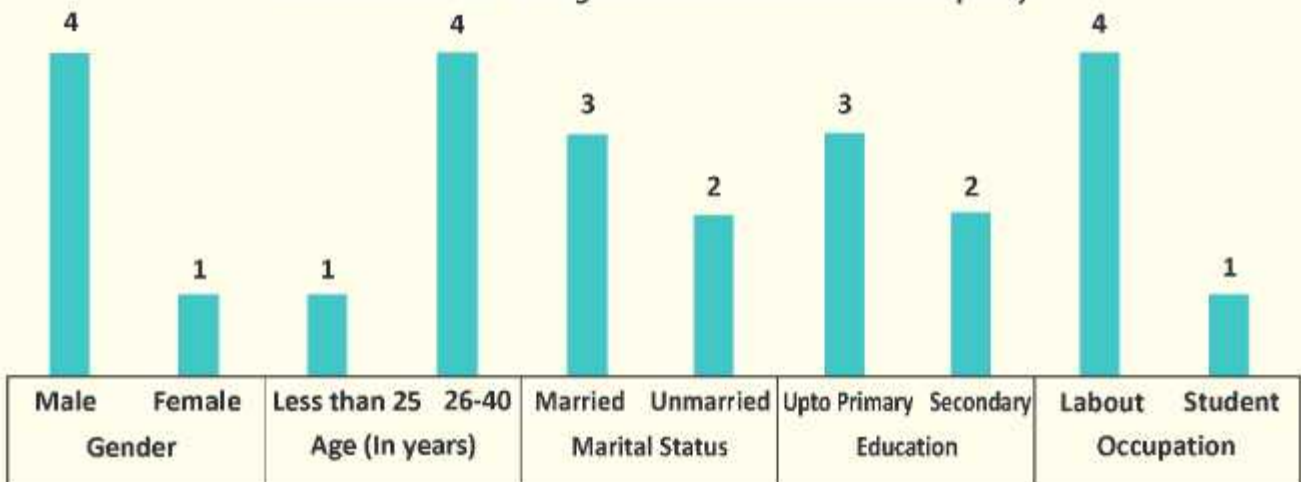

UVCT team identified an HIV positive case in CBS camp in Mangolepuri industrial area, the person was about 28 years old. The man was concerned due to his deteriorating health conditions but was hesitating in contacting team and was not at all supporting. The team motivated him in all possible ways and finally gets him linked to ART center. Finally, he was linked to the ART center in Baba Saheb Ambedkar hospital. Now he is taking ART regularly and got good health.

MUMBAI CHAPTER

UVCT Maharashtra chapter has been working since 1999 with various programmes for the development of Women and Adolescents. It continuously involved in many programmes, including collaborative projects with UNFPA; Municipal Corporations of Thane, Ullasnagar, Kalyan and Bhiwandi; and Central Social Welfare Board.

The centre is also working on remedial classes in Govt-aided schools; and vocational programs for women in need, besides conducting surveys to assess the needs of under-privileged school students.

Project Saksham: A Joint Venture by UVCT and Mahanagar Gas Limited for Empowering Students from Government and Aided Schools in Mumbai

The second phase of project Saksham was started in collaboration with Mahanagar Gas Limited (MGL) in Mumbai on 15th June, 2019.

The team started by taking remedial classes in the schools designated for the project. For the purpose selected teachers were trained by experts with a daylong training module for providing remedial education. A two-day holistic approach training was given to the teachers in the 'Quest program' conducted by the Lions Club of Ghatkopar. Science teachers were trained by the professor of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research in how to show practical in an indigenous manner without the regular apparatus. Mathematics and English subject teachers were also taught easy and new techniques to interact with the students in a play way. A customised syllabus and decided conspectus for each subject made it meticulous and systemized learning for students. Some Principals demanded for more teaching time from our teachers. Parent Orientations and Mohalla Meets were some of the highlights of the project. Around 3000 parents participated in various workshops on jewelry making, soap making (organic soaps), chocolate making, paper bag making, designer paper bags, envelopes and gift wrapping.

As an integral part of the project, group and individual counselling highlighted the promising and



problematic cases. Schools were given infrastructure help in terms of repairing the building, installation of projectors, etc. Mumbai team in the mentorship of Dr. Girish Kumar, Head, Mumbai Chapter deserve

appreciations for taking painstaking efforts in completed the task well in time. A special mention must be made of our secretary Ms. VishalaJayadev for her timely interventions as and when needed.

UVCT KALYAN RAILWAY CHILDLINE

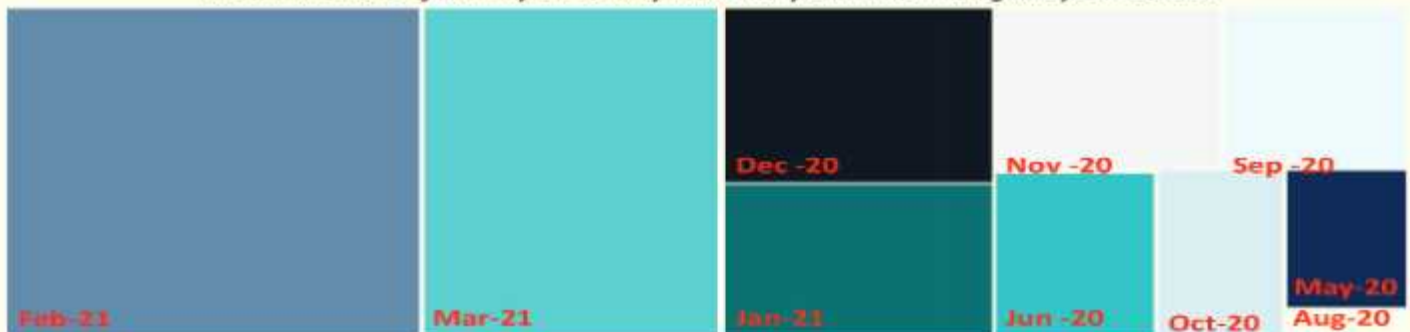
