Dear Friends,

During 2021-22, we have seen the tapering effects of COVID and its variants, though the age-old adage of 'Tiger coming and coming...' has kept threatening us. However, 'masks' are down and normal life seems to have resumed but funding for social service activities of local NGOs has remained elusive. At the same time, some international NGOs through their expensive publicity models are reportedly thriving.



clip of 'Sight Savers', is advertised in prime time of major TV channels, time and again, with a message to 'donate Rs.2000/- to restore the sight of an unfortunate child or a mother'. When one gets enthused to donate, the representative of the organization suggests why not donate Rs.3000/- for helping 2 persons.

What is intriguing is the same content, same set of beneficiaries and settings are shown in the video clip, month after month. Other fund-rich organizations also seem to engage professional fund raisers and well qualified CEOs to steer their way forward. During these unsettled times, our long continuing Target Intervention program for prevention of HIV/AIDS in North Delhi and Childline Project at Kalyan Railway Station carried on with their activities. In both the programmes delay in release of funds required attention of the funding government agencies. The vocational programmes bounced back with their usual aplomb in both Tagore Garden Centre in Delhi and Arilova in Visakhapatnam. Another new programme that we could get was UNICEF MH Childline Sub Centre in Thane Rural (Maharashtra). The objectives of the project are to educate residents about Child Rights and link up children in need of care and protection with the Government institutions for obtaining possible support to them. Though it is an open-ended programme with limited resources, the commitment shown by the staff under the guidance of Dr. Suvrata, the Honorary Director of the project is remarkable that has won the appreciations of UNICEF.

During the year, efforts were made to replicate our Tihar model of reformation and rehabilitation of young criminals. Jammu and Kashmir jail authorities showed some interest, which is being followed up. With reference to the GOI's plans to establish 200 odd 'Jan Sikshan Sansthan' (JSS) in different parts of the country, we also sought to have one JSS in UVNAC for the South west District, Delhi. We are hopeful as we have had long experience in organizing vocational courses. Alongside, we improved our manpower base, especially to strengthen our Counseling Center in UVNAC.

This is our 32nd year of existence. We are carrying on with our sheer commitment and resolve to empower young people. The struggle is satisfying and gives us strength to move forward. Our team is good and I thank every one of them.

Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust (UVCT) is a national level non-governmental organization, with a focus on social and economic empowerment of young adults (10 to 19 years). The trust has played a pioneering role in obtaining a distinct status for 'Adolescents' in the Indian planning system and programmatic initiatives. Established as the first ever National Centre for Adolescent in New Delhi, it focuses on a wide range of adolescent centric issues including Life Skill Education. UVCT has also played a distinct role in empowering girls from the marginalized sections of the society through education, and provision of health facilities and vocational training. Among many other development programmes, UVCT has undertaken projects for women empowerment and awareness campaigns on public health, environmental protection and reformation/rehabilitation of delinquents.

VISION: UVCT's vision is to find innovative ways to transform the ever-growing population of India or the "Burden of Population" into an "Asset of Human Resource" and thereby help in ensuring better utilization of India's demographic dividend.

MISSION: UVCT has been striving to work for the development of adolescents and young adults of the nation through "empowerment" rather than "control", and bring the dropouts, underachievers, and children in conflict with law, especially those belonging to marginalized and deprived sections of the society, back into the mainstream. It is UVCT's mission to help these children to become socially responsible and economically productive citizens of India and the world.


OBJECTIVES

- Promote Awareness of Adolescent Issues: Develop awareness through seminars, group discussions and camps and enable young adults to find solutions to their problems-psychological, financial, ethical and social. Development of a Realistic Value System Among Adolescents: Help adolescents acquire a realistic value system that is conducive to the development of a healthy society and the concept of oneness of all religions and love for the homeland in the youth by building their level of consciousness.
- Develop Educational & Skill Training: Develop educational and skill training programs for school drop-outs and under-achievers to enable them to become not only economically productive but also socially responsible citizens of India and the world.
- Develop Vocational Skills Among the Young Adults: Develop skills among the young adults and women with regard to textiles, handicrafts and other ancillary industries.
- Promote Equality of Status: Endeavor to promote equality of status and opportunity, assuring dignity of the individual, and the unity, integrity of the Nation, and services for the hygiene, health and happiness for all the citizens of India.
- Provide Financial Literacy for Youth & Women: Provide Financial Literacy to youth and women of backward communities for employment and banking related informed awareness.

ORGANISATIONAL PROFILE: UVCT is working in six states of India – Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Haryana, Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Telangana, besides a Chapter in the USA – with the support of Government Schemes, UN Organisations, PSUs and individual donors.



BUILDING ON NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF UVCT

- * Counselling and Career Guidance Programme (Project PRERANA): The Trust focuses on in-school adolescents to sustain their interest in education through Counselling and Career guidance (Project Prerana). The Trust conducted the first workshop on "Student Counselling: The Need of the Day" and visits were made to schools, especially the government-run, to make the adolescent students aware of coping mechanisms and the varied career avenues (through OUT-REACH PROGRAMMES).
- * Career Melas: As a corollary to the outreach efforts, as many as 40/50 Career Melas were held in the past in Delhi and in different parts of the country. A number of workshops/ Seminars were held to encourage and improve healthy inter-personal relations amongst Adolescents-Parents-Teachers.
- Personality Development for drop-outs and push-out children (Project SHAKTI): In India, a large number of children who are drop-outs or are pushed-out of the school system, require assistance and should become part of the mainstream education. For that purpose, an innovative programme "Shakti: The Personality Development" was launched in 1995. Batches of 30 to 40 drop-outs and under-achievers, were given a month's orientation to build on their existing strengths and tone-down their weak-points. By 2000, 30 batches of students of Shakti programme were given an orientation with remarkable results. UNFPA and UN IAWG P&D acknowledged UVCT'S Shakti Programme as a basis for their "Life Skills for promotion of Health for Out of School Adolescents" programme (July, 2003).
- Project SAHARA: To make the young people economically productive, the Trust provides training in various vocational and professional courses. UVCT got invite for accreditation from the National Open School for its course in Beauty Culture, Stitching & Embroidery, Typing and Word Processing.

- Financial Assistance to Students (Project UMMEED): Launched in October 2007, the project provides financial assistance in the form of school/college fees, books & stationery and other required support to those students who are academically brilliant, but economically poor.
- A Project to reform and rehabilitate young offenders in Tihar Prisons: Another salient effort has been of bringing the delinquent children and young offenders into the mainstream through 'Life Skills Education' and skill up-gradation programme. UVCT has been involved in augmenting the efforts of the juvenile justice system based on the LSE programme by transforming their personality and training them in various skills.



ADVOCATING FOR A DISTINCT STATUS FOR ADOLESCENTS

- UVCT organized a 3-day National Meet (July 1999), with the cooperation of the Ministry of Youth Affairs, GOI, and a few other like-minded NGOs/Organisations, on the theme, "Towards a Policy for Young Adults". Dr. Rao's article in Yojana, a Planning Commission Publication, and titled 'Adolescents say that they are no more Children' stirred the consciousness of the planners.
- In the year 2005, when Dr Abdul Kalam and other prominent leaders talked of making India a Super Power by 2020, UVCT organized yet another 3-day National Meet on 'Adolescents: Vision 2020'.
- National Seminar on "Demographic Dividend: Challenges of Young People in India, was organized in 2015 to strengthen the processes of involvement of young people for the national development.
- Second National Seminar on, "Mainstreaming Skills in Education" was organized in 2017 in collaboration with stakeholders from Skill Development and Education sectors.

* ESTABLISHING THE FIRST-EVER NATIONAL CENTRE FOR ADOLESCENTS

UVCT established the first ever 'National Centre for Adolescents', in September 2007 in Dwarka, New Delhi. The Centre had a distinguished visitor, Hon'ble, Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, Former President of India on 09 Oct 2008 when he held an interactive session with adolescents. The other notable visitors have been Sh. Shiv Raj Patil, Governor of Punjab and Dr Karan Singh, a Statesman and an eminent educationist.

+ ORGANISATIONAL STRENGTHS


Accredited and empanelled by the National CSR Hub at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai, UVCT developed a model of the Yuva Shakti Centres (YSC's) at different locations in India. This Model won the recognition of the CSR Hub and has been included, along with eight others, in their Proposal Bank of outstanding Social Sector Projects.


ACTIVITIES IN PROJECT MODE

- Vocational training in various marketable skills, with linkages to livelihood has helped more than 50,000 young adults, especially women belonging to the marginalized sections of the society. Projects were undertaken in Delhi, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh with the support of Govt. of India; UNFPA; Central Bank of India; IDBI Bank Ltd; IDBI Capital Services Ltd;
- Target Intervention Centers (HIV/AIDS) for Migrant workers in the industrial areas of Wazirpur (continuing since 2011) under DSACS, GNCT of Delhi;
- Empowerment of Government school children in rural areas of Delhi and Haryana was organized with the support of the National Children Fund and Jindal Foundation grants;
- Establishment of two Adolescent Centers -One in collaboration with BHEL, Hyderabad (2014-15) and with Vishakha Port Trust (under process);
- Two Projects in Delhi to bring the delinquent children into the mainstream through 'Life Skills Education' education and skill up gradation, with the support of the Govt. of Delhi (2007-08) and Delhi High Court (2015);
- UVCT's work in reformation of juvenile delinquents won appreciations, leading to a 3-year engagement in Reformation and Rehabilitation of Young Offenders, Jail No.5, Tihar Prisons (2017-20), partly funded by Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL); Adolescent Development Programmes under NPYAD Scheme of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India (since 1994 and continuing);
- STEP programme for women empowerment in Bindapur, Delhi, under the Ministry of Women and Child, Govt of India (2016-17);
- UVCT organized the Gender Resource Centre at Kapasheraas part of the Delhi Government Initiative (2012 2015);
- Child Line services have been in operation at the Kalyan Railway Station and Thane Rural (Maharashtra) under the aegis of the Child-line India Foundation since December 2016, which helped in rescuing more than 1000 distressed children and educating people about child rights and protection;
- UVCT, chosen as one of the six NGOs, provided value education for drug resistance in 120 schools of North District of Mumbai, under the Happy Mumbai project, funded by Tata Trusts (DESH), during 2016-19;
- * Under CSR projects of Mahanagar Gas Limited(MGL), UVCT undertook (2017-2020) a comprehensive Educational Empowerment of more than 30,000 under-privileged students in Maharashtra, from 10 Government and aided Schools in Kalyan area of Thane district and about 50 schools of North-east Mumbai area (Chembur, Deonar, Ghatkopar, Ashoknagar, etc), through various activities of remedial education, counseling, career guidance, Orientation of relevant Principals / teachers / Parents, of 60 schools in North East Mumbai (Projects Saksham 1 and Saksham 2);
- UVCT ran the IGNOU Study Centre for 10 years (2000-19) in Psychology and Social Work at Graduate and Post-Graduate level and made a difference in the lives of more than 10,000 students.

Dr. UNB Rao is a distinguished IPS Officer, who obtained his doctorate from the IIT (Delhi) on the subject of 'Student Psychology'. He co-authored the book, 'Adolescent concerns through their own Eyes', and he performed his police service commendably with utmost integrity, winning public trust and appreciations. He received the 'Police Medal for Meritorious Services' and ultimately the most prestigious 'President's Police Medal for Distinguished Services'.

IIT Delhi Alumni Association honored Dr. Rao for his 'Outstanding Contribution to the National Development'. He was also conferred with the prestigious "Mahatma Award for Lifetime Achievement, 2022", in appreciation of his impactful work with 'Adolescents and Young lives'.

Establishment

UVCT recognized that ADOLESCENTS (aged 10 to 19 years, as categorized by WHO) required a distinct status in the Indian planning and firmly advocated the same. UVCT established the first ever 'National Centre for Adolescents', in September 2007 in Dwarka, New Delhi.

UVNAC deals with important tasks such as planning, communications of projects and provides all kind of support to state teams. All projects and programmes conducted by UVCT and its state chapters are supervised and monitored by UVNAC. We conduct following programmes as an effort to focus on issues which affect

Activities at UVNAC

The pandemic of Covid-19 affected the activities of the whole world, the work done by the above and all its centers could not remain untouched by it. UVNAC, who is known as an outreach activities expert, could not continue many of his activities due to the safety guidelines of Covid. That's why the organization has decided that it will utilize this time in planning new schemes and in its introspection. During this, many changes were made such as connecting new expert advisors with the above, making new appointments according to the needs, recognizing our shortcomings and working on them. Some of these are as follows:

Online Meetings with Chapter Heads: To identify the gaps and to find solutions, many online meetings with all chapter heads were organized during this year to plan the way forward for UVCT. During these meetings members participated actively and came up with problems and solutions.

Additions in Human Resources: As per the planning, addition was made in the manpower of the organization. Some of them are:



- Principal Advisor: Professor (Dr.) Gita Bamezai, with an experience in Media and Communication Research has been appointed asthe Principal Advisor.
- Consultant-Resource Mobilisation: Mr. Ashwani Khanna has joined the organization as the Resource Mobilisation Consultant.
- Lead Data Analyst: Ms. Shashi Chhetri with an overall experience of more than 18 years has been appointed as the Lead Data Analyst.
- Deputy Director (Admin.): Mr. Vijay Kaul, has rejoined the position of Deputy Director (Admin.)
- Web Developer and Designer

Strengthen the Digital Presence of the Trust: In today's digital era, digital presence of any organization not only connects you with more



people but also gives you a platform to showcase your work and achievements. Although UVCT gives priority to working among the people, but due to COVID restrictions, UVNAC used the platform actively to connect with the people. A Web Developer and Designer has been also hired to update the website and social media platforms of UVCT on regular interval.

Upgrading the skills of the Employees: The progress of the employees also contributes in the development of the organisation.



A good organization not only understands this but also motivates its employees to move forward. UVNAC supports its employees technically and financially in skill up-gradation. This year too employees successfully completed the trainings organized by FICCI and NIIT.



Felicitation of the Field Staff of TI: Two field staff members from TI Wazirpur were felicitated with an honorarium at UVNAC for identifying and linking HIV positive cases to the ART centre.

Installation of Dustbins: Taking care of cleanliness in the area, the Trust installed hanging dustbins in the nearby area.

Collaboration: UVNAC collaborated with Melody Foundation and provided space at UVNAC building to run musical classes for the children. Employee of the Year Award (2021-22): Ms. Shivani Soni, Project In-charge of TI Wazirpur, UVCT was awarded the "Employee of the Year Award for 2021-22 for her accomplishments and in conducting her work with




SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE Tagore Garden, New Delhi

UVCT has a vision that adolescents should stand on their own feet so that they can contribute meaningfully to theirself-development, of their families and the country. Taking forward this thinking, the trust is running many skill development centers in different state chapters. Apart from life skill trainings, students from the underprivileged sections are trained in many skills in these centers. Skill Development Center at Tagore Garden is one of these centers. Courses like Basics and Advanced Training in Computers, Tally ERP, Spoken English and Personality Development are being runin collaboration with the NIIT. Courses in Cutting and Tailoring, Dress Designing, Stenography (English), Typing, Beauty Culture are also being run under the banner of the UVCT. Every year many children are enrolled in these professional courses and after completion of their training they can advance their career.



Almost 188 students enrolled in different courses during the FY 2021-22. Students enrolled during Covid have also completed their training during this financial year.



Apart from these regular courses, some lectures and workshops are also organized from time to time for the all-round development of the children coming to the centre. Some of which are as follows:

Legal Aid Camp: A Legal Aid Camp was organised in collaboration with Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DLSA) on September 13, 2021. Many women from surrounding areas attended the camp seeking legal advice.

Camp for updating Aadhar Card Details: Aadhar card has become the basic need of everyone nowadays. And due to the epidemic, people have trouble in using government facilities related to Aadhar card. Keeping this in mind, a camp was organized in collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DLSA) for correction in Aadharcard on September 13, 2021, Local people participated in the camp in large number.

Workshop on Menstruation Hygiene: Irritation, rashes or urinary tract infections

are some of the problems that every woman has to face during menstruation cycle. Understanding the need to educate girls students on menstruation hygiene, a one-day workshop on Menstruation Hygiene was conducted for the students of the Skill Development Centre, Tagore Garden in collaboration with Go Girl Foundation on 14.03.2022. Main objective of the workshop was to educate the students on menstruation hygiene and other topics related to menstruation like using clean pads, reusable and disposable pads, and cleanliness, especially during the menstruation cycle. Students were also taught some exercise to overcome the pain and cramps before and during the periods. Students also asked some questions related to blood flow, pain, benefit of using pads over cloth, etc.









TARGET INTERVENTION CENTRE Wazirpur Industrial Area, New Delhi

In Collaboration with Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS)

UVCT Targeted Intervention Center for HIV/AIDS located in Wazirpur Industrial Area of North-West district of Delhi works under the aegis of Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS). Aim of the centeristo create awareness amongsthe migrant population regarding HIV/AIDS and prevention. As part of its outreach activities, ICTC services, health camps, awareness programmes, registration of HRGs, and condom promotion are some of the activities conducted for the target population. Apart from this, the counselors give


HIV/AIDS related advice to the people. Street plays and rallies are also used to spread awareness among the people.

During the FY 2021-22, the team went in the field and made people aware about HIV/AIDS and other health facilities by following social distance norms. ICTC tests were conducted on HRG people and HIV positive people were linked to ART center for further treatment. The team also contributed in spreading awareness about COVID.



UVCT provided assistance for the migrant population during the pandemic by providing food, distribution of mask, gloves, sanitizers etc. UVCT team followed all guideline and aids which were provided by Delhi States Aids Control Society and NACO. successfully. Even today people are hesitant to talk about HIV/AIDS. Identifying 9 cases and successfully linking them to ART is a commendable work. ICTC testing was done on 4607 people and 100 STI cases were found in the health camps organized during the year.

Now both migrants are taking medicines regularly. The experience of working with UVCT has been very educative since I learnt many things regarding the HIV program. MAHARASHTRA CHAPTER

UVCT Maharashtra chapter has been working since 1999 with various programmes on development of Women and Adolescents in Maharashtra. The chapter has been organizing programmes from time to time including collaborative projects with UNFPA; Municipal Corporations of Thane, Ullasnagar, Kalyan and Bhiwandi; and Central Social Welfare Board. Of late, the center is working on remedial classes in Govtaided schools; and vocational programs for women in need, besides conducting surveys to assess the needs of the under-privileged school students.

UVCT KALYAN RAILWAY CHILDLINE



Childline is a 24 hours national helpline working since 2018 for children in the age group of up to 18 years. Any concerned person or child can call on 1098 helpline for the care and protection of a child. Childline work for the protection of the rights of all children in general, but special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially from the more vulnerable sections. Number of Children who were provided intervention by UVCT Childline team during the year 2021-22 was more than 250.

Major Activities Undertaken Childline are:

- Awareness Campaign about Childline programme
- Training and Orientation programme related to Children
- Collaboration with other organisations
- Conduct personal and group outreach programmes on stations

Our team members had obtained the required permissions and worked shoulder to shoulder with the Covid Warriors functioning at the railway station. Consistently creating awareness among various groups of railway officials, staff, coolies, cleaners, general public so that they could help the team in Child Protection. The formation of Child Help Group was an important aspect that was taken up by UVCT Kalyan Railway Childline team.

Future Plans.....

The action plan for the year ahead will be a value addition to the existing programmes and and some new initiatives to create a safer, secure and more equitable future for adolescents, yound adults and women.

Advocacy and Building Relationships: To build relationships with schools, PSUs, other NGOs, Academic Institutes, Government agencies, and communities to support UVCT's work and create advocates for adolescent issues.

Educational Events/Activities:

- Improve the physical, social emotional and intellectual needs of adolescents, youth and women by building their capacities, conducting workshops, career guidance
- To reform a Youth/Child Club in UVNAC in the coming year, so that we can continue our mission by helping children and adolescents

Empowering Adolescents, Youth Adults and Women:

- To upgrade the Skill Development Centres with more advanced professional courses and with latest technologies
- Linking the trainees to livelihood by providing them counselling and proper guidance
- Formation of Self-Help Groups (SHGs)
- Create a pool of volunteers for our existing and future projects/activites.

Pathway Programmes: A Pragmatic Way to Learning: Since its inception UVCT has been providing counselling to students in different schools. Earlier it was done in collaboration to government and other PSUs. After COVID pandemic it has been studied that children/adolescent are going through different types of stresses. Reaslising the need UVCT is planning a programme in collaboration with the schools. Under this programme students, parents and teachers will be counselled on different issues as per the requirement.

Health:

- Besides working on TI project at Wazirpur under the aegis of DSACS, we will take care of children of HIV/AIDS patients.
- We also aim to extend our help to promote health education and awareness campaign among school going children and out of school adolescents

Reformation and Rehabilitation programme for Young Offenders: With the prior experience in the field of R&R UVCT will try to restart the programme in Prisons and Reformation Centres in India. UVCT's has initiated R&R work singularly with juveniles in conflict with law in response to the recommendation of Delhi High Court's Juvenile Justice Committee, chaired by Justice Madan Lokur (a doyen in Prison Reforms), way back in 2007. About 250 Children in Conflict with Law (CCL) housed in 'Sewa Kutir', Kingsway Camp, New Delhi were assisted with counselling and extending Life Skills Education programme. Based on this experience, UVCT's launched Parivartan programme in 2008 and prepared a comprehensive Model for reformation and rehabilitation. This Model once again came to the notice of Delhi High Court Juvenile Justice Committee, which funded a joint proposal of AACCI (Association of Adolescent and Child Care in India) and UVCT,



in Jan- Mar 2014, to conduct angermanagement and Life Skills training in the 'Place of Safety' and Special Home located at Majnu Ka Tila, Delhi. UVCT carried on the Tihar Jail Project, on it's own steam, for two years (2017-19) and thereafter, for one year (2019-20) with the help of funding from Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL). The Project helped in making a remarkable difference in the lives of 1200 young offenders.

Media Management: Ensure that the success stories and lessons learnt get uploaded on all social media platforms

Collaboration with Corporate Associates and PSUs: Expanding interaction with PSUs to get support in our work. Since UVNAC is the first ever National Center for Adolescents in Delhi, UVCT is going to start skill upgradation activities at UVNAC for Children, Adolescents and Women to help them in becoming self dependent

Research: To strengthen our research cell so that we can be more focused on the areas requiring more support. Besides this, we intend to undertake evaluation of our previous programmes.

Hum Kishore Festival: Over the years, UVCT has been organizing Hum Kishor Festival in collaboration with a few sponsors. Many competitions in dance, cultural dance, singing, musical instruments, art and craft, rangoli, mehandi etc. were organized in this festival. In which many schools in and around Dwarka used to participate with great enthusiasm. This year it will be the endeavor of the trust to make the platform available again to the teenagers to showcase their talent.

Opening New Chapters: UVCT will plan to expand its horizons and add new chapters with cooperation of Corporate Associate and PSUs.
